GRANT IN AID AND SCHOLARSHIP 2001-2002

A limited amount of scholarship and grant funds are available to assist students with their financial needs. Applicants will be reviewed on the basis of both financial need and academic achievement or potential. Additional criteria for specific scholarship awards are outlined below:

- Students must be enrolled either in an M.A., M.Div., or B.A. program to be considered for assistance. Grants and scholarships are not available to Certificate of Theological Studies or Special Status students.
- Students must be enrolled at least half-time (six units each semester) to be eligible for funds.
- Awards are based upon full-time (12 unit) enrollment and will be disbursed proportionately, not exceeding one-third tuition.

The Holy Rosary Education Fund The Holy Rosary Education Fund has been established to foster greater theological understanding of the place of Mary, the Mother of God, in salvation history. The Fund provides one or more scholarships, on an annual basis, to any student enrolled in a degree program at DSPT who is studying and writing a thesis on a Mariological topic or, who takes one Mariological course during the year in which they receive assistance from this fund.

The Jacob Levitan Preaching Fund This fund has been established to provide financial assistance for preaching programs sponsored by the School, which includes both faculty stipends as well as scholarships for any students participating in such programs.

The Maureen Elizabeth Rettig Scholarship The Maureen Elizabeth Rettig Scholarship has been established to provide one or more grants, on an annual basis, to students enrolled in a degree program at DSPT.

The Sylvia and Bernard Gay Scholarship The Bernard and Sylvia Gay Scholarship has been established to provide one or more grants, on an annual basis, to any students enrolled in a degree program at DSPT.

The Sophie C. Zawisha Scholarship The Sophie C. Zawisha Scholarship has been established to provide one or more grants, on an annual basis, to lay students enrolled in a degree program at DSPT.

Grant-in-Aid A limited number of grant-in-aid funds for tuition credit are available to students enrolled in degree programs.
